Prospect

There are approximately ten thousand species of birds on the planet and no single individual has seen them all. This was coined by Bernd Brunner who has authored many publications on birds. There are over 900 species of birds found in the United States and Canada. There have been studies that show that the sounds of birds, especially songbirds, have consistently shown to improve mood and mental alertness.

Some locally found birds with beautiful sounds include:

- Northern mockingbirds are typically gray-brown, paler on the breast and belly, with two white wing bars on each wing. They are especially known for their ability to mimic everything from sirens to crickets to other bird species.
- American Robins which are ubiquitous in this area often make a mumbled sound to communicate with each other or a sharp sound like an alarm call. They also make a repeated sound that rises in volume and can sound like a laugh or chuckle.
- The Wood Thrush is a reclusive bird and is a medium-sized plump, soft-plumaged bird with brown upper parts with mottled brown and white underparts. The song of the male is often cited as being the most beautiful in North America.
- The Carolina Wren is a reddish-brown with orange-brown underparts with a dark slightly curved beak. It has a long tail that flicks up and down as it forages for food or flits among bushes.

Northern Cardinals are ubiquitous throughout the year and are unusual in the fact that both male and females sing. Males sing throughout the year but typically the peak of their singing is spring and early summer.

Another bird seen throughout Prospect Point with a very distinctive haunting sound is the Mourning Dove also known as the turtle dove. These are light gray and brown and generally muted in color.

For those who wish to learn more about local birds, Spring Grove Cemetery sponsors periodic bird walks throughout the year with an expert ornithologist. The local Audubon Society also hosts events such as nature walks and hikes through the area with experts.

As David Attenborough stated "Everyone likes birds. What wild creature is more accessible to our eyes and ears, as close to us and everyone in the world, as universal as a bird?"

Gutter Cleaning

Note: If you have a stopped or overflowing gutter, call Rentz Management to have a workorder opened. Previously the gutters were cleaned twice per year along with any additional cleaning required. With gutter guards now installed, any gutter cleaning is done on an as needed basis.
